What Do We Believe?

The Bible is our only rule of faith and practice. Our church also uses the *Westminster Confession of Faith* and the accompanying *Larger* and *Shorter Catechisms* as a helpful summary which sets forth the system of doctrine taught in the Bible.

We emphasize to each individual the importance of living a holy life and carrying out the Great Commission, both here and abroad, through evangelism and the support of missions.

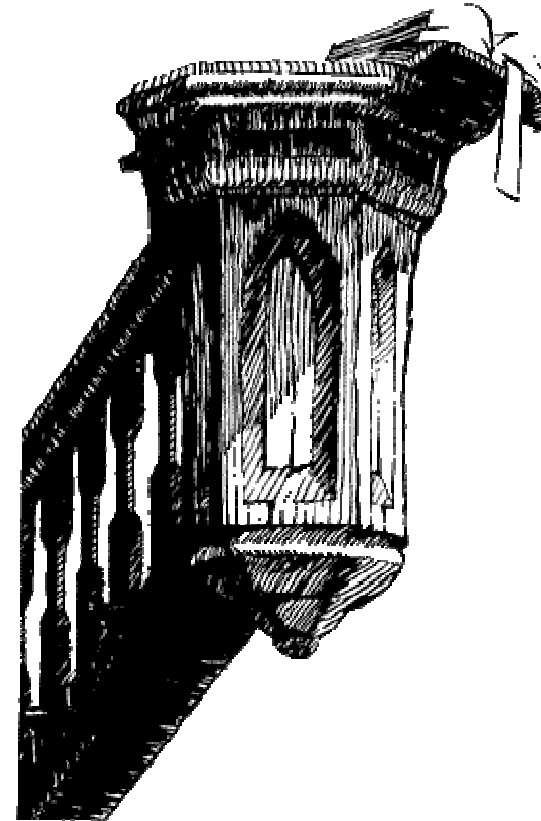
